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#### COMMENTARY

When you receive this Newsletter in your inbox at around 4pm this afternoon we will be presenting to the Hospitality and Tourism APPPG in Westminster. The focus of the meeting is around how Statutory Registration in our sector, if implemented properly, is a game changer for the sector. It has always been one of the PASC UK founding principles that all operators should operate on a level playing field.

You can see the slides below that we will be using this afternoon.

Members constantly ask why, when they are taking the Fire Regs so seriously, when others, often neighbours who 'just airbnb' their property, are not complying? A reasonably robust Statutory Registration Scheme would weed out the ones that have misunderstood that it all applies to them too as well as the bad actors, as they would have to comply to get a Registration number.

A scheme such as this would be in stark contrast to Scotland, where licensing is punitive in the extreme, in Wales they are still looking at a licensing scheme albeit in a much lighter form, so England has the chance to get the balance right.

Sadly, darker clouds on the horizon, we have seen announcements from Sir Kier Starmer, Labour Party leader that he would introduce Licensing immediately, without Consultation. We will have to watch that closely and meet with as many Labour MP's as possible to demonstrate the potential for harm such a policy entails. <https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-politics-67087861>

Moving back to the Fire Regs, we have booked another Fire Webinar specifically to cover Fire Doors on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November. Yet another Consultation this week, this time on waste, and it will impact all of us, as we will have to separate our waste in a certain way by 2027, unless we have ten or more employees. ## WHAT IS NEEDED TO MAKE IT EFFECTIVE?



- Mandatory annual national scheme
- Includes all properties that let even for a single night
- Cost around £100 p.a. Per business
- Applied locally by Councils
- Funding sufficient for reasonable audit of at risk properties

## THE SCHEME



- Information to be provided focussed on Safety
- Only gather relevant information
- Initial registration (all info)
- Subsequent renewals (only relevant changes)
- Payment = Registration Number

## BENEFITS



- Accurate National/Regional/Local Data
- Level playing field at last
- All England safe and legal
- Get the data first
- Then look if planning changes necessary

## **WASTE DISPOSAL – NEW SCHEME PROPOSED FOR ENGLAND**

You may have seen in the last week media coverage of the Government's plan for waste disposal in England. The new Government plan includes not just domestic waste - as reported in the media - but also waste from commercial premises, such as holiday lets.

This is similar to the scheme already coming into force in Wales.

### **Scheme for both households and commercial premises**

The Government's plan is to bring in a simplified, national waste scheme, where all local authorities in England collect the same waste streams for composting and recycling.

There will be a system of three waste containers: dry recycling, food waste, and residual (non-recyclable), with garden waste collection as an optional extra for households.

Non-household premises - such as holiday lets - in England will need to adopt the same three main waste streams as households.

### **What does this mean for holiday lets in England?**

At present, holiday let waste is normally managed through a commercial waste contract (either third party or local authority). Many suppliers of commercial waste services do not distinguish between different types of waste - it is all mixed in a single bag or bin.

Under the new arrangements, commercial waste services will need to collect waste using the same three categories as for households: dry recycling, food waste, and residual (non-recyclable).

You as the property owner will need to present your waste to your service provider in line with these categories. That of course means you will need to collect and store your waste on site in these categories.

### **How it will come into force?**

There will be statutory regulations.

### **Implementation dates**

Businesses will need to have these recycling streams in place by March 2025, except for micro-firms (fewer than 10 FTE employees), which need to have the scheme in place by March 2027.

## **GREAT BRITISH HOLIDAY SURVEY RESULTS REPEAT**

Huge thank you to all those that took part, we closed the survey on Monday with 1735 responses, as we will be quoting the data in a major report to be published shortly.

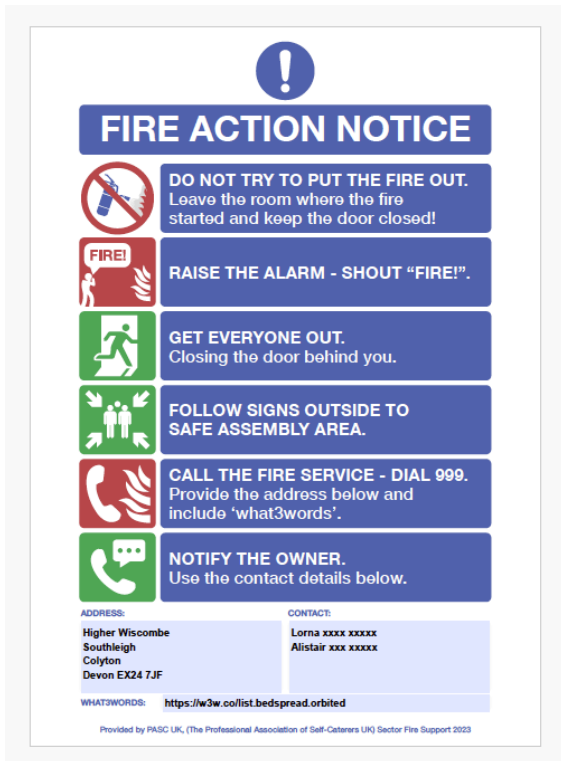
Some key points coming from the survey:

- 42% developed their letting property from scratch, not from existing housing stock
- 32% are limited by Planning Consent to only be short term lets
- 52% have operated for more than 10 years as a short term let
- 88% let for more than 105 nights per year
- 54% pay more than £15.00 per hour for their support team
- Only 5% pay between £10.00 and £12.50 per hour
- 78% are in favour of Statutory Registration in England, 5% are not, 17% don't know

We will be using this data in both upcoming reports and in our lobbying, so once again, thanks very much for your support on this 😊
